

In order to improve veterinary border control of animals **from 20 March 2026**, in the CHEDA document on the import and transit of companion animals, **in field I.9.**

Accompanying documents, a scan of:

- health certificate,
- result of the rabies antibody titration test,
- certified copy of detailed information regarding:
 - II. description of the animal
 - III. identification
 - IV. anti-rabies vaccination
 - V. confirmation of submission of the anti-rabies antibody titration test
 - IX. clinical examination

In addition, for animals with the result of the rabies antibody titration test performed in laboratories in Ukraine, in accordance with Art. 27 *Commission Regulation (EU) No 142/2011 of 25 February 2011 implementing Regulation (EC) No 1069/2009 of the European Parliament and of the Council laying down health rules as regards animal by-products and derived products not intended for human consumption and implementing Council Directive 97/78/EC as regards certain samples and items exempt from veterinary checks at the border under that Directive*, **provide during the inspection documentation confirming the transit of research and diagnostic samples within the EU territory** to the above-mentioned laboratories.

However, animals transported by the same means of transport, to the same consignee, coming from the same territory or a third country, **if they belong to different species, should be covered by a separate health certificate for each of these species.**
